Subject: Financial Update - For 2nd Quarter 2023

<u>Item:</u> Attached is a year-to-date revenue report and expenditure by department report for the general fund as well as an overall current cash and investment report. The reports attached reflect activity through 2^{nd} quarter 2023 (first six months of the year)

As you will see in the attached revenue and expenditure reports, the actual numbers are tracking about where they should be for this point in the year in comparison to the budgeted totals.

Revenues are tracking where they should be as our overall collections are at 49% of our budgeted amounts for 2022. During 2022 at the same time (6/30/22) revenue collections were 44% of general fund budgeted revenues.

On the expenditure report most items are tracking as expected as well. Overall general fund expenditures are at about 53% year to date in comparison to the total 2023 general fund budgeted expenditures. For 2022 the actual general fund expenditure at the end of the second quarter (6/30/22) was 48% of general fund budgeted expenditures. Last year at this time we had not been billed yet for our Hennepin County Assessor services for the year. If you factor in that timing difference, the percentage ends up being very similar when comparing 2023 to 2022.

The current cash and investment total for all funds as of June 2023 is \$18,292,870.48

This information item is a normal update to Council for tracking the 2023 budget to actual numbers.

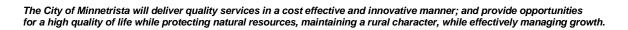

Issue:

Corks for a Cause is scheduled to be held on Saturday, August 12, 2023 from 5 pm to 9 pm at Minnetonka Orchard located at 6530 County Road 26. This event features live music, a gourmet pizza bar, and a commemorative glass for tastings from a variety of Minnesota wineries. This year's event will benefit the Eli Hart Memorial Playground. A temporary on-sale liquor license is required to conduct this event.

Background:

Temporary intoxicating liquor licenses, with the approval of the Commissioner of Public Safety, may be issued only in connection with a social event sponsored by a club, charitable, religious, or other nonprofit corporation that has existed for at least three years. They may not have an interest in the manufacture or wholesale of alcoholic beverages and cannot have been convicted of a felony or willful violation of federal, state or local ordinance governing the manufacture, sale, distribution or possession for sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages in the last five years. No license shall be for longer than four consecutive days, and the city shall issue no more than 12 days of temporary licenses to any one organization in one calendar year.

Discussion:

All required documentation has been submitted by the applicant, and the Minnetrista Public Safety Department has verified that the applicants named in application have not been convicted within the past five years for any violation of Laws of the State of Minnesota or the City of Minnetrista relating to alcohol. As such, staff would recommend approval of the one day temporary on-sale liquor license for the Northwest Tonka Lions to host the Corks for a Cause event at Minnetonka Orchards with the following conditions:

- 1. No alcoholic beverages may be allowed on the property except those being provided by participating Minnesota wineries.
- 2. No alcoholic beverages may leave the property.
- 3. On-site ability to call 911 must be provided at the event location.
- 4. All appropriate postings and laws must be enforced.

Mission Statement:

The City of Minnetrista will deliver quality services in a cost effective and innovative manner and provide opportunities for a high quality of life while protecting natural resources and maintaining a rural character.

5. No one under the age of 21 will be permitted at the event.

Conclusion:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve a temporary one-day intoxicating liquor license for the Corks for a Cause event being held on Saturday, August 12, 2023 at Minnetonka Orchard located at 6530 County Road 26, Minnetrista held by the Northwest Tonka Lions.

Overview: Joseph and Megan Webster (the "Applicants") have made a request for a rear yard setback variance to reduce the required setback from 50 feet to 41 feet to allow for a home addition at 8280 County Road 15; AP – Agriculture Preserve Zoning District; PID# 08-117-24-43-0003 (the "Property").

Background: The Applicants have owned the Property since 2008, which contains a single family dwelling built in 1972. Seeking to renovate the dated dwelling, the Applicants applied for a building permit to add a 2 car attached garage with living space above. The existing home does not currently have an attached garage. During the permit review process, staff noticed that the proposed addition does not meet the required rear yard setback of 50 feet. This is because the existing home sits almost entirely within the required setback, making it very difficult for the Applicants to conform to the setback requirements. The Applicants have set the home as far away from the rear property line as they can while maintaining the functional flow of the home, but unfortunately cannot meet the setback requirement and approval of a variance is necessary. City staff has outlined the variance process and submittal requirements to the Applicants. The Applicants have put together the necessary documents attached hereto for the City Council to consider.

<u>Variance Request:</u> City Code Section 505.05 Subd. 9 allows the City to issue variances from the provisions of the zoning code. A variance is a modification or variation of the provisions of the zoning code as applied to a specific piece of. A variance is only permitted when:

a. The variance is in harmony with the general purposes and intent of this ordinance.

Section 505.03 Subd. 1 outlines the specific purpose and intent of the City's zoning ordinance. One of those purpose and intent is to protect the general health and safety of the inhabitants of the City. This is accomplished through the promotion of proper use of land and structures with reasonable standards to which buildings, structures, and land will conform to for the benefit of all.

Mission Statement:

The existing home is located 28 feet from the rear property line. The Applicants have placed the proposed addition as far from the rear property line as they can while maintaining functionality. Given the situation, the Applicants have done the best they can to maintain reasonable setback standards for the proposed addition by not further encroaching upon the rear property line and the adjacent property.

b. The variance is consistent with the comprehensive plan.

The basic intent of the comprehensive planning process is to provide a well-founded and coordinated decision-making framework to guide both public and private development and community improvements. In this regard, the comprehensive plan represents the development framework to guide and direct future land development decisions within the City. The Land Use Plan is a narrative and graphic representation of the community's land use and growth management goals and policies that provides the background and rationale for land use designations as represented on the Proposed Land Use Map.

The Property and surrounding area are guided for long term Permanent Agriculture per the 2040 Minnetrista Comprehensive Plan. The proposed variance does not alter the future use of the Property and thus remains consistent with the long term goals for the area, which includes low density single family residential. In addition to simply complying with the future land use plan, the proposed addition preserves the neighboring property views and does not further crowd the adjacent properties because the existing home already sits closer to the rear property line than the proposed addition.

A variance may be granted when the applicant establishes there are practical difficulties in complying with this ordinance. Practical difficulties, as used in connection with granting a variance, means:

1. The property owner proposes to use the property in a reasonable manner not permitted by this ordinance.

This factor means that the landowner would like to use the property in a particular reasonable way, but cannot do so under the rules of the ordinance. It does not mean that the land cannot be put to any reasonable use whatsoever without the variance.

The proposed addition and remodel project includes an attached garage, which the home does not currently have. The proposed addition is also set back further from the rear property line than the existing home's current setback. The proposal also complies with all other requirements of City Code, including hardcover allowance and front yard setback. Based on all these factors, the Applicants requests is reasonable.

Mission Statement:

2. The plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner.

The uniqueness generally relates to the physical characteristics of the particular piece of property, that is, to the land and not personal characteristics or preferences of the landowner. When considering the variance for a building to encroach or intrude into a setback, the focus of this factor is whether there is anything physically unique about the particular piece of property.

The existing home was built in 1972 in its current location, which is non-conforming with respects to the rear yard setback requirement. This is well before the Applicants purchased the Property in 2008, so they could not have created this situation themselves. The Property is also non-conforming with respects to the lot standards for the Agriculture Preserve zoning district. This is further complicated by the right-of-way for County Road 15, which has been applied since the lot was created. When all these factors are put together, they create a unique set of circumstances for the Applicants that they themselves did not create.

3. The variance would not alter the essential character of the locality.

Under this factor, consider whether the resulting structure will be out of scale, out of place, or otherwise inconsistent with the surrounding area.

The locality is spread out due to the rural nature of the area, but the proposed addition includes a 2 car attached garage which is common amongst the other homes in the area. The proposed addition also does not increase the building height and the resulting footprint is consistent with the area. It also does not encroach further upon any property line or roadway. That said, the proposed addition does not alter the character of the locality.

<u>Neighborhood Comments:</u> Notices were sent out to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject property prior to the public hearing with the Planning Commission. Staff did not speak with any neighboring property owners, but did receive one written comment in support of this request as a result of sending the public notice. The written comment has been attached for review.

<u>Planning Commission Recommendation:</u> The Applicants' request was presented to the Planning Commission at their June 26th meeting. At that meeting, the Planning Commission discussed the Applicants' request and held the required public hearing. Outside of the Applicants, there was no one present to speak regarding the request. After hearing no testimony at the public hearing and after considering the entire record before them, the Planning Commission made a motion to recommend the City Council approve the requested rear yard setback variance, based on certain findings of fact and subject to conditions. Motion passed 5-0. Absent: Taylor, Livermore, Gangestad (Alternate 1), and Ragnoli (Alternate 2).

Mission Statement:

<u>Conclusion:</u> The City Council should review the staff report and the recommendation of the Planning Commission. After review, the City Council should consider the entire record before it prior to making a motion. Along with making a motion, findings of fact should be established which support the motion. Findings of fact based on the information submitted by the Applicants may be as follows:

- 1. The requested variance is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the City's zoning ordinances because the proposed addition does not extend closer to the rear property line than the existing dwelling and provides the most reasonable setback given the circumstances;
- 2. The requested variance is consistent with the City's comprehensive plan because the Property is guided for long term Permanent Agriculture per the 2040 Minnetrista Comprehensive Plan. The proposed variance is consistent with this long term goal as single family residential is an allowed use and the proposed addition does not impede on views from or encroach further upon adjacent properties;
- 3. The Applicants propose to use the Property in a reasonable manner because the proposed addition includes an attached garage and master bedroom suite, both of which are reasonable, and the Applicants have done the best they can to set back the addition as far back from the rear property line as functionally possible;
- 4. The requested variance is the result of unique circumstances not created by the landowner because the Applicants did not build the home in its current non-conforming location and the lot was created before the right-of-way for County Road 15 was established which decreases the buildable area when the 50 foot setbacks from the front and rear lot lines are applied; and
- 5. The requested variance will not alter the character of the locality because the proposed addition includes an attached 2 car garage which is consistent with the surrounding area and the overall size of the structure remains in line, both in height and footprint, as the other homes in the area.

Recommended Action: Motion to adopt a resolution approving the requested rear yard setback variance at 8280 County Road 15 based on certain findings of fact outlined in the staff report and subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The construction shall be consistent with the plan and survey documents submitted with this variance application;
- 2. Any required grading shall maintain existing drainage patterns or improve the existing drainage of the lot and adjacent lots;
- 3. The Applicants obtain all necessary permits and approvals from the City and other applicable entities with jurisdiction over the Property prior to any construction;
- 4. The Applicants are responsible for all fees incurred by the City in review of this application; and
- 5. The variance approval is valid for one year from the date of approval and will become void and expire unless a building permit has been issued for the site.

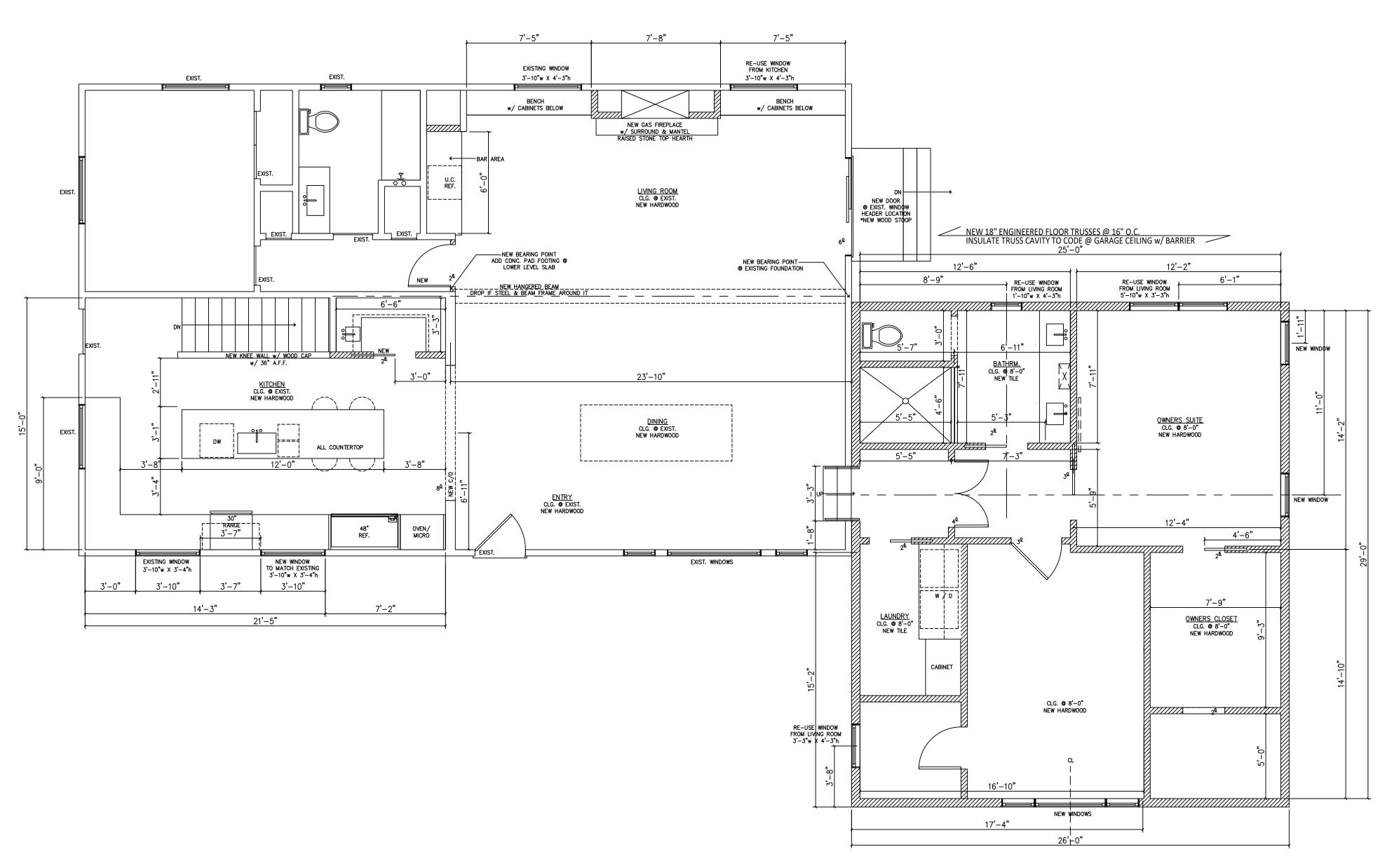

WHEREAS, the City of Minnetrista (the "City") is a municipal corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Minnetrista has adopted zoning and subdivision regulations, per Chapter 5 of the Municipal Code, to promote the orderly, economic and safe development and utilization of land within the city; and

WHEREAS, Joseph and Megan Webster (the "Applicants") have made an application for a variance from the required rear yard setback to reduce the required setback from 50 feet to 41 feet to allow for a home addition and remodel at 8280 County Road 15 (the "Property") and which is legally on Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2023, the Minnetrista Planning Commission considered the requested rear yard setback variance, held a public hearing and, after consideration of the entire record before it, voted 5-0 in favor of recommending approval of the requested setback variance; and

WHEREAS, the Minnetrista City Council has reviewed the application, as submitted, and has made the following findings of fact:

- 1. The requested variance is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the City's zoning ordinances because the proposed addition does not extend closer to the rear property line than the existing dwelling and provides the most reasonable setback given the circumstances;
- 2. The requested variance is consistent with the City's comprehensive plan because the Property is guided for long term Permanent Agriculture per the 2040 Minnetrista Comprehensive Plan. The proposed variance is consistent with this long term goal as single family residential is an allowed use and the proposed addition does not impede on views from or encroach further upon adjacent properties;
- 3. The Applicants propose to use the Property in a reasonable manner because the proposed addition includes an attached garage and master bedroom suite, both of which are reasonable, and the Applicants have done the best they can to set back the addition as far back from the rear property line as functionally possible;
- 4. The requested variance is the result of unique circumstances not created by the landowner because the Applicants did not build the home in its current non-conforming location and the lot was created before the right-of-way for County Road 15 was established which decreases the buildable area when the 50 foot setbacks from the front and rear lot lines are applied; and

5. The requested variance will not alter the character of the locality because the proposed addition includes an attached 2 car garage which is consistent with the surrounding area and the overall size of the structure remains in line, both in height and footprint, as the other homes in the area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Minnetrista hereby approves the requested rear yard setback variance to allow for a home addition and remodel on the property generally located at 8280 County Road 15, subject to the following conditions:

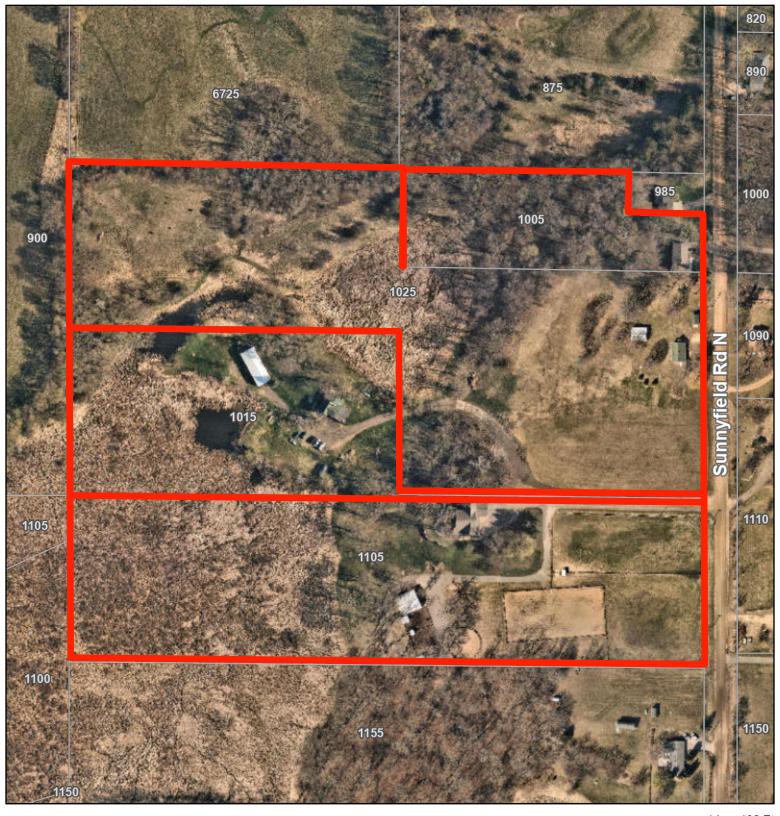

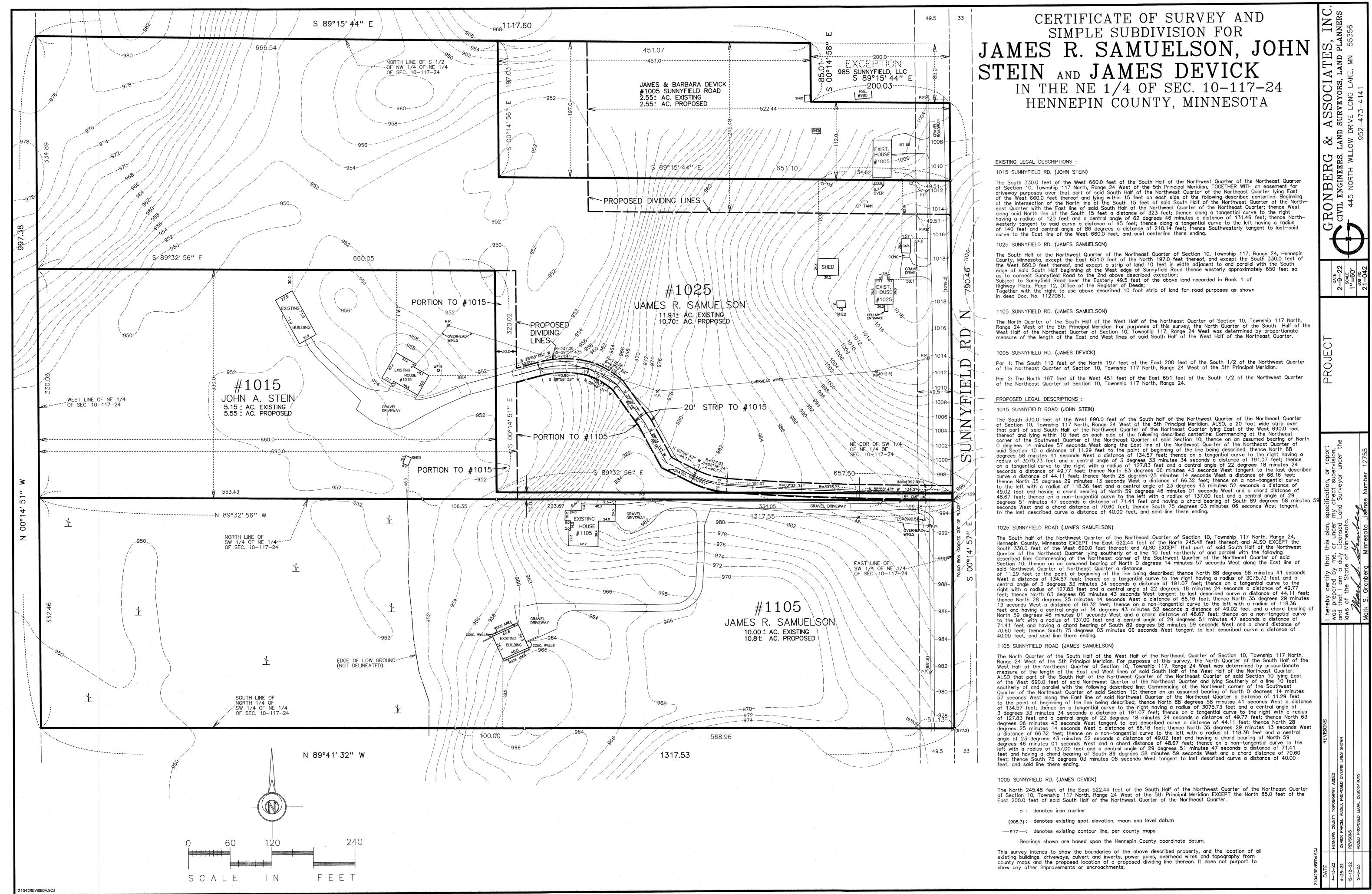

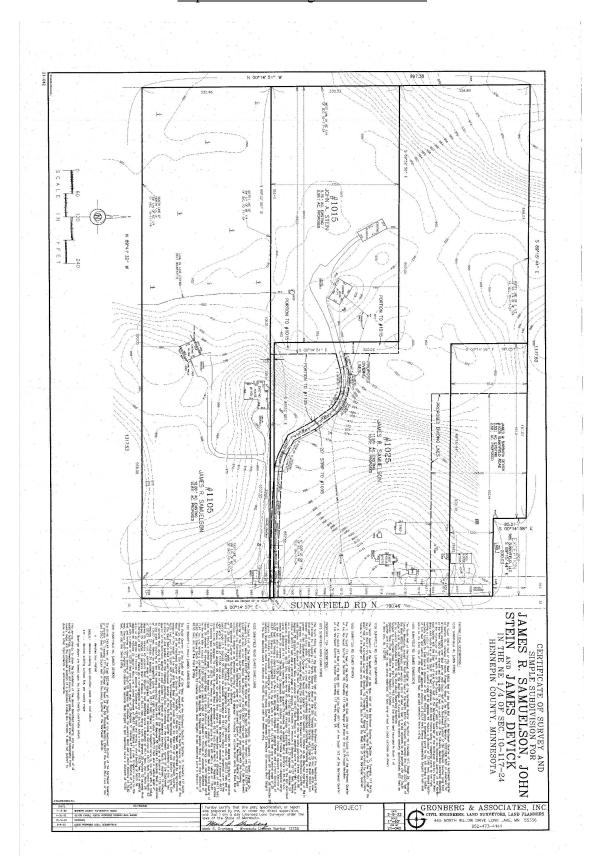

Discussion/Overview:

Minnetrista Public Works Utility Department needs to replace a 20+ year old safety/rescue tripod system. This device is used when a public works employee must enter a utility access hole, or any other confined space entry for maintenance purposes. Our current tripod is 20-plus years old and only has one retrieval rescue reel. All new rescue tripod units have two reels – a primary and a secondary back up. CenterPoint Energy offers Community Safety Grants to help with the purchase of such equipment. The City applied for and was awarded one of these grants. The new tripod we will be purchasing is the French Creek S50G-M7 combination system tripod shown below.



The MW50G rescue winch along with the R50G 3-way winch/lifeline, gives us redundant rescue capability. If the main winch fails, you simply switch over to the other winch and the rescue can continue. Our current rescue tripod does not have a backup system. This new system also has a self-retracting lifeline mode. This means its cable will extend/retract as a person is being lowered or raised. We will also be purchasing storage bags to keep equipment in top working condition.

Mission Statement:

Fiscal Impact:

The cost of this system, complete with storage bags, is around \$3,300.00. CenterPoint Energy will cover half that purchase price, and the City has received a check from them in the amount of \$1,650.00. The remaining \$1,650.00 will be funded by the 602 Sewer Maintenance Fund.

Recommended City Council Action:

Motion to accept \$1,650.00 from the CenterPoint Energy Community Safety Grant to use toward the purchase a new French Creek S50G-M7 combination system rescue tripod for use in the Sewer Utility Department.

<u>Issue:</u> Should the City Council adopt an interim ordinance (moratorium) that would temporarily prohibit the establishment and operation of cannabis businesses within the city of Minnetrista?

Background: The City Council addressed cannabis and hemp product regulation at its work session on June 5th and Council meeting on June 26th. The City Council adopted a 12-month moratorium on the sale of certain products containing tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) (such as gummies and beverages) that are derived from hemp, which have been available since 2022. The City Council indicated that it consider adopting a cannabis business moratorium after July 1, 2023, as allowed by the Cannabis Act.

The attached interim ordinance does the following:

- Temporarily prohibits the establishment and operation of cannabis businesses within the city of Minnetrista and authorizes a study regarding regulating cannabis businesses in the City.
- Allows the City time to review and consider model ordinances and administrative rules that will be drafted by the newly established Office of Cannabis Management and consider adopting longer term regulations (e.g., zoning regulations) before the Office of Cannabis Management can issue any licenses.
- Exempts businesses currently operating under the medical cannabis program.
- Addresses cannabis businesses but does not impact Interim Ordinance 483 regarding certain hemp products.

Fiscal Impact: There is no fiscal impact on the City resulting from this matter.

ORDINANCE NO. 484

CITY OF MINNETRISTA COUNTY OF HENNEPIN STATE OF MINNESOTA

AN INTERIM ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A STUDY AND IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE OPERATION OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES WITHIN THE CITY OF MINNETRISTA

CITY OF MINNETRISTA DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND AUTHORITY.

- A. The Minnesota Legislature recently enacted, and the Governor signed, 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 H.F. No. 100 (the "Act"), which is comprehensive legislation relating to cannabis including, but not limited to, the establishment of the Office of Cannabis Management ("OCM"), legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products by adults, providing for the licensing, inspection, and regulation of cannabis and hemp businesses, taxing the sale of cannabis flower, cannabis products, and certain hemp products, establishing grant and loan programs, amending criminal penalties, providing for expungement of certain convictions, and providing for the temporary regulation of Edible Cannabinoid Products.
- B. The Act provides local units of government certain authority related to Cannabis Businesses, including the authority to (i) require local registration of certain Cannabis Businesses operating retail establishments, (ii) adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, provided that such restrictions do not prohibit the establishment or operation of a Cannabis Business, (iii) limit the number of certain Cannabis Businesses based on the population of the community, and (iv) prohibit the operation of a Cannabis Business within 1,000 feet of a school, or 500 feet of a day care, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field.
- C. The Act requires the OCM, which was established effective July 1, 2023, to work with local governments to develop model ordinances for reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses. The Act also requires the OCM to establish additional rules and regulations relating to the operation of Cannabis Businesses. It is anticipated that the city of Minnetrista (the "City") will benefit from reviewing and analyzing the OCM's model ordinances, rules and regulations before making any decisions related to the regulation of Cannabis Businesses in the City.
- D. The Act (Minnesota Statutes, section 342.13(e)) expressly allows a local unit of government that is conducting studies or has authorized a study to be

conducted or has held or scheduled a hearing for the purpose of considering adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses to adopt an interim ordinance applicable to all or part of its jurisdiction for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens. The interim ordinance may regulate, restrict, or prohibit the operation of Cannabis Businesses within the jurisdiction or a portion thereof until January 1, 2025.

- E. Given the uncertainty regarding the model ordinances to be developed by the OCM and the broad scope of the changes to Minnesota law brought about by the Act, the City desires to adopt an interim ordinance for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens.
- F. The City desires to conduct a study for the purpose of considering the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses as well as the other regulations local units of government may adopt under the Act.
- G. On July 17, 2023, after providing at least 10 days published notice, the City Council held a public hearing regarding the consideration and adoption of an interim ordinance prohibiting the operation of Cannabis Businesses within the City until January 1, 2025.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the meaning given them in this section.

- A. "Act" means 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 (H.F. No. 100).
- B. "Cannabis Business" has the meaning given the term in Minnesota Statutes, section 342.01, subdivision 14.
- C. "City" means the city of Minnetrista, a Minnesota municipal corporation.
- D. "Edible Cannabinoid Product" has the meaning given the term in Minnesota Statutes, section 151.72, subdivision 1(f).
- E. "OCM" means the Office of Cannabis Management, established as set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 342.02, subd. 1.
- F. "Ordinance" means this interim ordinance, which is adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 342.13(e).

SECTION 3. STUDY AUTHORIZED. The City Council hereby authorizes and directs City staff to conduct a study regarding the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, as well as other

potential local regulations allowed under the Act, and report to the City Council on the potential regulation of Cannabis Businesses. The study may include a review of any model ordinances that OCM is directed to draft under Minnesota Statutes, section 342.13(d), an analysis of potential setback regulations allowed under Minnesota Statues, section 342.13(c), and such other matters as staff may determine are relevant to the City Council's consideration of this matter. The report may also include City staff's recommendations on whether the City Council should adopt regulations and, if so, the recommended types of regulations.

SECTION 4. MORATORIUM. A moratorium is hereby imposed on the operation of any Cannabis Business within the City. During the term of this Ordinance, no business, person, or entity may establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City. Accordingly, during the period that this Ordinance is in effect, the City shall not accept, process, or act on any application, site plan, building permit, zoning request, or other approval, including any requested confirmation, certification, approval, or other request from the OCM or other governmental entity requesting City review of any application or proposal for a business proposing to engage in the operation of a Cannabis Business. During the term of the moratorium, it is a violation of this Ordinance for any business, person, or entity to establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the City.

SECTION 5. EXCEPTIONS. The moratorium imposed by this Ordinance does not apply to: (i) the continued operation of a duly established business as part of the Medical Cannabis Program administered by the Minnesota Department of Health that was lawfully operating within the City prior to the effective date of this Ordinance; or (ii) the sale of Edible Cannabinoid Products under Minnesota Statutes, Section 151.72, Lower-Potency Hemp Edibles, or Hemp-Derived Consumer Products, provided, however, that nothing in this Ordinance exempts a business, person, or entity from complying with all other requirements and prohibitions of applicable laws and ordinances related to such exceptions. For example, the sale of certain products derived from hemp that contain tetrahydrocannabinol are currently prohibited pursuant to Interim Ordinance No. 483 – Prohibiting the Sale, Testing, Manufacturing, Cultivating, Growing, Transporting, Delivery and Distribution of Certain Products Containing THC.

SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT. Violation of this Ordinance is a misdemeanor. The City may also enforce this Ordinance by mandamus, injunction, or other appropriate civil remedy in any court of competent jurisdiction. A violation of this Ordinance is also subject to the City's general penalties prescribed in the city code and may further result in the City reporting violations to the OCM, if relevant to OCM licensing. The City Council hereby authorizes City staff and consultants to initiate any legal action deemed necessary to secure compliance with this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 7</u>. SEVERABILITY. Every section, provision, and part of this Ordinance is declared severable from every other section, provision, and part. If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not invalidate any other section, provision, or part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERM. This Ordinance shall become effective on the first day of publication after adoption. This Ordinance shall remain in effect until January 1, 2025, or until the City Council expressly repeals it, whichever occurs first.

The interim ordinance temporarily prohibits the establishment and operation of all cannabis businesses within the city of Minnetrista. The interim ordinance also authorizes a study on city regulations of cannabis businesses and will allow the city to review yet to be published model ordinances and administrative rules from the newly established Office of Cannabis Management. Currently operating Medical Cannabis Businesses are exempt. The interim ordinance addresses cannabis businesses and does not impact Interim Ordinance 483 regarding certain hemp products. Accept quotes to complete the crack sealing and associated work as proposed in the quote package for the 2023 Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project, City Project 04-23.

Background/Discussion:

The goal was to get the quote package out early in the bidding season and provide a flexible window for start of construction to generate interest. One quote was received and is \$5,407 over budget. Based on feedback received from the contractors and discussions with city staff we recommend requoting the project and posting on QuestCDN to generate more interest. Below is a summary for the quotes received in the rebid of the 2023 Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project, City Project 04-23.
